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## **Preface**

This report provides a detailed statistical summary of adult offenders under the Kansas community corrections system during fiscal year 2019. The report is based on data pulled from the Total Offender Activity Documentation System (TOADS). The number of offenders for whom information is available varies across data items. The data may differ from other reports published by the Kansas Department of Corrections and the Kansas Sentencing Commission because this report reflects information for community corrections offenders only; captures different data elements; and is captured at different points in time. Each set of data is prefaced with a short description of content.

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## SECTION I

### Average Daily Population

The first section of data consists of the average daily population (ADP) for the community corrections offender population. These data are presented in two sections of three tables each for a total of six tables.

Monthly Actual ADP is the ADP average for that particular month.

Table 1 – Monthly Actual ADP by Agency

Johnson County – this number includes both AISP and Residential ADP

Sedgwick County – this number includes AISP, Drug Court, and Residential ADP

Table 2 – Monthly Actual ADP for each Residential Center

Table 3 – Monthly Actual Absconder ADP by Agency

Johnson County – this number includes both AISP and Residential absconders

Sedgwick County – this number includes AISP, Drug Court and Residential absconders

Twelve Month ADP is an ADP averaged over the last 12 months. Example: June 2019 ADP looks at the ADP from July 2018 – June 2019 (12 months).

Johnson County – this number includes both AISP and Residential ADP

Sedgwick County – this number includes AISP, Drug Court, and Residential ADP



## SECTION II

### Files Closed by Agency and Closure Type

The data in Section II is a one page snap-shot of how offender files closed in fiscal year 2019. Case closure types split by the gender of the offender is also presented. Information was pulled from the agency's individual Court Case Sentencing Activity Reports which were run starting on 7/24/19 at 02:56:11 PM, and concluded on 7/25/19 at 10:43:31 AM. The statewide total numbers were pulled from the statewide Court Case Sentencing Activity Report, which was run on 7/25/19 at 05:09:45 PM.

In Table 1, you may notice that if you sum up all the agencies they will not equal the statewide total. This is because looking at the data from the agency perspective, offender have the possibility of having more than one file in the state during that particular time frame, as an offender may have a closed case in more than one community correction agency. An offender is counted once per agency, but can be in more than one agency's total– in data terms, the offender can be duplicated. The statewide summary and totals, however, the actual offender is only counted once regardless of how many agencies in which the offender had closed cases – in data terms the offender is unduplicated. Please note, however, that in Table 2, the statewide numbers are the sum of all of the agencies. This is because the same report that is used to obtain the statewide totals in Table 1 does not include a breakdown by the offender's gender.

Figures 1 and 3 present the total number of cases that closed broken down into racial and age groups.




Figure 3: Statewide Closures by Age Group





Figure 4: Statewide Closures by Termination Reason and Age Group












#### **Files Closed by Type Fiscal Years 2014 – 2019**


A number of closure types are included in the group of successfully closed cases. In addition to cases that were successfully closed, cases that were terminated due to the offender's death, the offender not being sentenced to community corrections, and cases that were unsuccessfully closed for any reason (closed by court, remanded to jail, etc.) were classified as successfully closed. The group measuring revocation terminations is comprised of cases that were revoked due to a new misdemeanor, cases revoked due to condition violations, and cases revoked due to a new misdemeanor.

All information for Section III was pulled from the agency's individual Court Case Sentencing Report starting on 7/24/19 at 02:56:11 PM, and concluded on 7/25/19 at 10:43:31 AM. The statewide total numbers were pulled from the statewide Court Case Sentencing Activity Report, which was run on 7/25/19 at 05:09:45 PM.
























## SECTION IV

### Sentencing Departures by Agency and Statewide

Data was pulled from the Court Case Departures Report (export to Excel) within TOADS for FY19 only. There are several departure types but only the four most utilized departure types are included (as the report does not make a distinction between a Double Downward; Double Upward; or Up & Down departure).

The sentencing court may depart upward to increase the length of a sentence up to double the duration (**Upward Durational Departure**) within the sentencing grid block.

The court may also depart downward to lower the duration of a presumptive sentence (**Downward Durational**).

The sentencing court may depart upward to increase the type of supervision from probation to prison (**Upward Dispositional**)

The sentencing court may also depart downward to decrease the type of supervision from prison to probation (**Downward Dispositional**).

## **SECTION V**

### **Termination Reason by Risk Level**

This is a quick snapshot of the number of offenders LSI-R risk level by termination reason for all agencies and statewide during fiscal year 2019. The second page is the percentage of offenders LSI-R risk level by termination reason. Numbers were pulled from TOADS using the SB14 Planning Report run on 7/30/2019 at 1:04 pm. There will be several offenders who did not have an LSI-R supervision level. Also, offenders who were Not Sentenced to Community Corrections or who Died were not included in the LSI-R risk level data.

As stated for Section II, you may notice that if you sum up all the agencies they will not equal the statewide total. This is because looking at the data from the agency perspective, offender have the possibility of having more than one file in the state during that particular time frame, as an offender may have a closed case in more than one community correction agency. An offender is counted once per agency, but can be in more than one agency's total— in data terms, the offender can be duplicated. The statewide summary and totals, however, the actual offender is only counted once regardless of how many agencies in which the offender had closed cases – in data terms the offender is unduplicated.











