**STANDARD:** Written policy, procedure and practice shall state that the Community Supervision Agency shall not condone any actions by Community Supervision Agency staff that may constitute physical, emotional or sexual abuse of the juvenile. Acts include but are not limited to: sexual contact, hitting, shaking, cursing, threatening, binding, closeting, prolonged isolation, meal denial as a punishment and derogatory remarks about the juvenile and/or the juvenile’s family. The Community Supervision Agency staff and/or administration shall take the proper corrective action in response to such prohibited acts, including reporting suspected abuse as required by K.S.A. 38-2223.

**DISCUSSION:** None.

**NOTE:** The standards and procedures set forth herein are intended to establish operational guidelines for community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners and their employees/contractors and the juvenile offenders under supervision. They are not intended to establish state created liberty interests for community supervision agencies, or the board of county commissioners, or their employees/contractors, or juvenile offenders, or an independent duty owed by the Kansas Department of Corrections- Division of Juvenile Services to community supervision agencies operating through the board of county commissioners or their employees/contractors, supervised juvenile offenders or third parties. This standard and procedure is not intended to establish or create new constitutional rights or to enlarge or expand upon existing constitutional rights or duties.
